Subject: District 2 Area Rate for Paved Shoulders		
Motion for Council to Consider:		
<p>That Halifax Regional Council waive section 17 of Administrative Order One, requiring a staff report, and:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Direct the Chief Administrative Officer to enter into agreement with the Province of Nova Scotia (PNS) by March 28, 2025 to pave extended shoulders at a minimum width of 1.5 metres along:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Route 357, from Trunk 7 northerly for 6 kilometres at an estimated cost of \$1,525,000, andb. Crowell Road, from Route 207 to Marjorie Drive for 5.42 kilometres at an estimated cost of \$2,160,000.2. Levy a uniform charge, currently estimated at \$241.00 per property, for a period of 10 years starting in 2026/27 in the community of Musquodoboit Harbour to recover the cost of paving extended shoulders along Route 357, with the final charge determined by the PNS invoice for the work.3. Levy a uniform charge, currently estimated at \$563.00 per property, for a period of 10 years starting in 2026/27 in the community of East Lawrencetown to recover the cost of paving extended shoulders along Crowell Road, with the final charge determined by the PNS invoice for the work.		
Reason:		
<p>The Province of Nova Scotia is doing a recapitalization of the Crowell Road and Route 357 which is an opportunity to enhance the roadway infrastructure in the communities of East Lawrencetown and Musquodoboit Harbour.</p> <p>This motion introduces and implements an area rate to the communities affected where the paved shoulders would be located.</p>
