Reason: There continues to be "swirl" and "chatter" around the potential for strong mayor powers in Nova Scotia. When asked by the press in February and June, the Minister of Municipal Affairs indicated that there are no immediate plans to put forward strong mayor powers here, but that he hasn't ruled them out. The Minister has also indicated that informal conversations have occurred on the topic with some of the Province's mayors, including HRM. The Minister has publicly indicated a willingness to discuss these issues with municipalities. While HRM isn't seeking any legislative changes at this time, HRM should register it's request that if the Province is contemplating fundamental changes to how municipal governance and democracy functions, that this only proceed through engagement and consultation with the Province's municipalities.
