
# 1. Age

Construction date is 1911

## 2b. Architectural Importance

Unique example of Halifax Box style house with abundant finishing

Halifax Box: These compact and land efficient homes often adopted a plain architectural style with simple box shapes, while still decorating their façade with features from Italianate or Second Empire styles.

Unique Elements of subject building: running trim, two bay windows, porch covering the entrance.

Built by Jeremiah Gray and Thomas R. Flinn

- Builders, Architects, and Developers
- Several Halifax box buildings on South Street

#### 4a. Architectural Merit [Construction Type]

- Balloon framing wood construction
- Poured concrete foundation







## 4b. Architectural Merit [Style]

The character defining elements of 6105 Willow Street include but are not limited to:

- Two-storey, Halifax Box style house with a flat roof and wood shake cladding
- Cornices with fleur running trims and corbels on the east and south elevations
- Two-storey bay window composed of two sets of three, one-over-one wood-framed windows with string courses and corbel detailing
- One-storey bay window with three one-over-one wood-framed windows with running trims and corbel detailing on the east elevation
- Main entrance door with transom, frieze and pilasters
- Open porch with railings on the first floor and second floor, square columns, running trims, and corbels









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


### 5. Architectural Integrity

High integrity, no footprint change.

Minor modifications:

- the original windows have been replaced with vinyl sashes
- some window frames have metal cladding on the surface
- the support concrete post for the rear porch has been removed
- a balcony has been added to the second floor at the rear











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# 6. Relationship to Surrounding Area

- Located within the proposed Young-Woodill Heritage Conservation District study area
- Dominated with two-storey Halifax Box style and other Late Victorian Plain style houses
- Near three registered heritage Properties.
